The Rehabilitation curriculum is 120 hours. Requirements for graduation include attaining a minimum grade point average of 2.0 overall and a “C” or higher in major and bona fide minor courses; completion of 120 credit hours; passage of the Writing Proficiency; and completion of Service Learning and African American experience requirements.

Note 1: Student Advising Responsibilities: Learn your curriculum and check with your advisor as needed for guidance. **You should see your departmental advisor at least once per semester.** See page 3 for advisor names and contact information. Semester of course offerings sometimes changes based on department needs and student demand.

Note 2: Statistics Requirement: You must take either SMAT 130B/MATH 274, PSYC 274, or SOCL 350 to satisfy the Statistics requirement. **This course is a pre-requisite for Rehabilitation Research.**

Note 3: Introduction to Rehabilitation Class Order

INTRO **ALWAYS** should be the first or among the first rehab classes taken. Course 1 (Intro) & 3-8 in any combo, can be taken concurrently. Course 2 (Ethics/Case Doc) should be taken as *Part II of Intro* (i.e., Schedule it the semester after Intro). You can take 1 & 2 together if, unfortunately, you are *retaking* Course 1 (Intro).

Note 4: Field Experience Requirements: Field classes (494, 495,496) should be scheduled for the last 3 semesters/sessions of matriculation (summer is NOT a semester). Courses 1-5, minimally, must be taken BEFORE taking any Field class. Field courses cannot be taken together, and you must have taken and passed REHB 494 before taking either field class.

Note 6: Science Requirement: Students must choose a six-hour sequence in either the biological or physical sciences and a three-hour course in an area other than that selected for the sequence. One course must be taken with a lab.
