The Department offers a pre-professional program of study leading to the Bachelor of Science Degree in Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology. Students enrolled in this program must complete a total of 119 semester hours (outside of Service Learning), 43 of which must be in speech-language pathology and audiology, including courses in basic speech and language science, audiology, communicative disorders, assessment, and therapeutic intervention. To enhance future career opportunities, the program provides for twelve hours of free electives which students are encouraged to combine with the six hours of required foreign language courses for a total of eighteen hours in a foreign language needed to earn a minor in Spanish or French through the Foreign Language Department.
