Graduating Students

- Graduating Students' Grades are due **May 1, 2026**, via Self-Service Banner.

Non-Graduating Students

- Final exams for Non-Graduating Students are scheduled for **May 7 – 13, 2026**.
 - All non-graduating students' final grades are due by **May 13, 2026**, via Self-Service Banner.
- Examinations for times not listed should be administered during the last class meeting of the course. All grades should be submitted via Self-Service Banner no later than **May 13, 2026**.
- Make-up exams should be administered **May 12, 2026, between 6pm – 8pm** or **May 13, 2026, between 2pm – 4pm**.

- Online courses should be administered utilizing the Learning Management System (Canvas) between **May 7 and May 13, 2026**.
- Evening course exams (Monday only, Tuesday only, Wednesday only, Thursday only) are to be administered on the day of the actual course during the period, **May 7 – May 13, 2026**.

Special Notes to Adhere to:

- What if my course time is not on the final exam schedule? (Non-Graduating Students)
 - If your time is not identified on the final exam schedule, be sure to contact the instructor of record to obtain information on the day and time of your final exam(s).

- Examinations for times not listed should be administered during the last class meeting of the course or by **May 13, 2026**.
- Conflicts in examination times should be mediated by the student and the course instructor. Space to administer the exam should be arranged with the Department Chairperson.
 - Make-up exams should be administered **May 12, 2026, between 6pm – 8pm** or **May 13, 2026, between 2pm – 4pm**.
- Examinations in laboratory, physical education activity classes, and classes whose credit hours are less than three (3) may be administered during the last regularly scheduled laboratory/class period. When an examination covers lecture materials or both laboratory and lecture materials, the examination should be given at the time prescribed for the lecture in this schedule.
- Students with Extended Time, Distraction Free Testing Environment, Private Testing Room, or other approved accommodations should contact ods@sus.edu.
- Accommodations, with advanced approvals, should be provided for students who are approved by the Office of Disability Services (letters were provided to the instructor).
- Instructors have the option to utilize the university's learning management system (LMS), Canvas, to administer final examinations. The LMS will protect students' privacy and preserve the record for student grade disputes, if needed. Further, Canvas creates a record of assessment of course learning outcomes.
