- 1. Dr. Kimberly K. Powell (Assistant Professor of Marketing) stated, "I am currently reading 'Hot, Flat, and Crowded' by Thomas L. Friedman. This book would increase student intellect in the context of sustainability, biodiversity, the green movement, and the political warfare regarding oil dependency."
- 2. Dr. Mysore Ramaswamy (Professor of Management) stated, "I recommend 'Who Owns the Future?' by Jaron Lanier. This deals with the effects of network technologies on our economy.
- 3. Dr. Joseph Ben Omonuk (Former Associate Professor of Accounting) stated, "I would recommend 'Who Moved My Cheese' by Spencer Johnson. It is not a recent book but it is captivating.
