
HBCU PARTNER OPPORTUNITIES

"More than 75% of students at HBCUs rely on Pell Grants and nearly 13% rely on PLUS Loans to meet their college expenses. INTERL SCHOLARSHIP

Through the collaborative partnership with UNCF, Intel Corporation has established a scholarship program to help STEM students get on the fast track to a rewarding career. - Maintain cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale;
- Major in following academic disciplines:

Chemistry, Chemical Engineering, Computer Engineering, Computer Science, Electrical Engineering, Electrical & Computer Engineering, Material Engineering or Science, Mechanical Engineering, Physics, Neuroscience, Business, Economics and Marketing.

CHEVERON CORPORATE SCHOLARS

Chevron has partnered with UNCF to create the Chevron Corporate Scholars Program.

This program is accepting applications from graduating high school seniors who have been accepted to an accredited four-year college or university and will begin college in fall 2021 as a college freshman.
