JAG S.T.A.R.S.

The David Scott JAG S.T.A.R.S. Scholarship is a partnership between the USDA and Southern University's 1890 Historically Black Land-Grant Institution.

The goal of the JAG S.T.A.R.S. Scholarship is to increase the number of minorities studying food, agriculture, natural resources, and human sciences.

Students selected for the scholarship will be awarded each semester based on their academic performance and financial need.

- ACT composite score of 18 or SAT equivalent

TMCF ALL AROUND SCHOLARSHIP - SUMMER

The Thurgood Marshall College Fund (TMCF) is proud to offer financial assistance to outstanding students attending a Historically Black College and University (HBCUs) and Predominantly Black Institutions (PBIs). Scholars will be selected to receive a summer scholarship for 2021-2022 academic school year (which can only be applied to verifiable costs associated with average tuition and usual fees).





ALL AROUND SCHOLARSHIP - SUMMER

Deadline: May 16, 2022

Eligibility Requirements

- Be enrolled full-time and/or part-time as an undergraduate or graduate student attending an accredited HBCU or a PBI during the summer session of the 2021-2022 academic school year.
- Current cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or higher.
- Able to demonstrate leadership abilities.
- Able to demonstrate a financial need.
- Be a **U.S. Citizen or legal permanent resident** with a valid permanent resident card or passport stamped I-551.

TMCF COVID-19 EMERGENCY AWARD

The Thurgood Marshall College Fund (TMCF) and varying partners are proud to offer COVID-19 emergency financial assistance to students attending one of TMCF's 47 publicly-supported Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) or Predominantly Black Institutions (PBIs). Students selected will receive an emergency award of up to \$1,000 for the 2021-2022 academic school year. Funding is intended to allow students to meet their needs and continue their education. Funding is available until the funds are exhausted or until the end of the summer term 2022, whichever comes first.





TMCF COVID-10 EMERGENCY AWARD

Deadline: May 16, 2022

Eligibility Requirements

- Be enrolled full-time as a freshman, sophomore, junior or senior undergraduate at a TMCF member-school during the summer session of the 2021-2022 academic school year.
- Current cumulative grade point average of **2.5 or higher**.
- Be a U.S. Citizen or legal permanent resident with a valid permanent resident card or passport stamped I-551.

TMCF will only consider requests to cover expenses in five areas: IT/Technology, Housing/Rent, Food Insecurity, Transportation/Travel, Mental Heath

SALLIE MAE FUND COMPLETING THE DREAM GAP SCHOLARSHIP

The Thurgood Marshall College Fund (TMCF) and Sallie Mae Fund are proud to offer financial assistance to outstanding students attending an accredited post-secondary institution or continuous education program. Two hundred and fifty (250) students completing a two-year, four-year, or trade/vocational certificate/certification program will be selected to receive a gap scholarship up to \$2,500 for the 2021 - 2022 academic school year. Selected students must be in good academic standing, but at risk of not returning to or graduating/ completing due to an outstanding financial need, and/or emergency situation that leads to a financial aid crisis.





SALLIE MAE FUND COMPLETING THE DREAM GAP SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: August 31, 2022

Eligibility Requirements

- Enrolled full-time or part-time at an accredited post-secondary institution Two-year Schools, Four-year Schools, Vocational/Technical certificate/certification program
- Open to Seniors planning to complete their degree or program by the end of Spring 2022 semester.
- Current cumulative grade point average of 2.75 or higher
- Be a U.S. Citizen or legal permanent resident with a valid permanent resident card or passport stamped I-551
- Be a diverse candidate. Diverse shall include, but not limited to: Gender, Disability, Race, Ethnicity
- Belonging to an underserved community
- Able to demonstrate **leadership abilities**.
- Demonstrate good moral character in all aspects of your life,.

UNCF DOMINO'S PIZZA SCHOLARSHIP

The UNCF Domino's Pizza Scholarship was established in collaboration with UNCF to provide scholarships to students of any classification who are attending a UNCF member HBCU or another four-year, accredited HBCU.





UNCF DIMINO'S PIZZA SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: April 28, 2022

Eligibility Requirements

- Possess a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale.
- Complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid ("FAFSA") form.
- Have a demonstrated, unmet financial need as verified by their college or university.
- Be a student of any classification enrolled full-time at a UNCF member institution,
- Pursuing a major in accounting, supply chain, business, management, communications, journalism, engineering, entrepreneurship, information ("IT"), or hospitality.

CVS HEALTH CARE CAREERS SCHOLARSHIP

qualified African American or

CVS HEALTH SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: April 28, 2022

Eligibility Requirements

- Be a junior in the Fall 2022 semester at the time of the initial award.
- Be a Black or Latinx student enrolled full-time at any accredited four-year college or university in the U.S.
- Have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- Have completed the Free Application for Federal Student Aid ("FAFSA") form
- Have an unmet financial need as verified by the student's college or university of enrollment
- Have an interest in pursuing a career in the health care sector
- Be pursuing a major in pharmacy, nursing, business management, biology, biochemistry, finance, operations/supply chain, data analytics, information technology, actuary, or human resources.

LIGHTED PATHWAYS SCHOLARSHIP

Light a pathway to a successful future working as an investment, asset, or financial manager! This opportunity is both a scholarship AND paid internship that exposes African American students to careers in finance and asset management in Boston. This opportunity has two components: a scholarship and an internship. By applying for this scholarship, you are also committing to a potential summer internship placement in summer 2023 that will include complimentary housing, transportation, a meal plan, and other wrap-around services.





SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: May 2, 2022

Eligibility Requirements

- Current Freshman or Sophomores
- Have a 2.7 GPA or higher
- Enrolled at an accredited Four-Year college or university; and
- African-American/Identify as African-American.
- All majors are eligible, with a preference for Business,
 Finance, Computer Science, Engineering, or Math majors.

JACK AND JILL FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Jack and Jill of America
Foundation Scholarship will provide
need-based scholarships to serviceoriented African American rising
college freshmen who have
completed a minimum of 60 hours of
community service activities during
the 2021-2022 academic year. Award
funds will be disbursed in the 20222023 academic year. This scholarship
may be renewed in the sophomore
through senior years for recipients
who qualify.





JACK AND JILL FOUNDADTION SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: May 11, 2022

Eligibility Requirements

- Be African American and a US citizen or permanent US resident.
- Be currently classified as a graduating high school senior.
- Be enrolled full-time for the 2022-2023 academic year at any accredited 4year college or university.
- Have a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of **3.0 on a 4.0 scale**.
- Have completed a minimum of 60 hours of active community service activities between June 2021 - May 2022. The service hour requirement will not be waived.
- Have completed a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FASFA) and have a demonstrated unmet financial need as verified by the applicant's institution.

ADP HBCU SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The ADP HBCU Scholarship
Program provides need-based scholarship assistance to help reduce financial barriers to college completion for high-potential college students from low- to mid-income families, attending historically black colleges and universities ("HBCUs").





ADP HBCU SCHOLARSHIP

Deadline: May 14, 2022

Eligibility Requirements

- Be a citizen, national, or legal permanent resident of the U.S.
- Complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid ("FAFSA") form and have a demonstrated, unmet financial need as verified by their college or university.
- Possess a minimum cumulative college GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
- Be Pursuing in any the following fields of study: Business, Communications, Information Technology/Computer Science. Example majors are:
- Demonstrate involvement in community and/or campus-based activities, programs or clubs, or part-time work.


