### COURSE OPTIONS

**ARTS ELECTIVE** - SFIA101B (ARTS200), MUSC200B or MUSC353B. History of Jazz (MUSC353B) may be used to meet both the arts elective and African American experience requirements.

**BIOLOGY** – Seven (7) credit hours of any combination of the following: General Biology, Microbiology, Human Anatomy and Physiology

**COMPUTER SCIENCE ELECTIVE** - Introduction to Computer Technology, CMPS105B or Microcomputer Applications in Business, CMPS 290B or Approved Substitute.

**ENGLISH - Literature Elective** - ENGL205B, SENL220B (ENGL201), or SENL240B(ENGL203). African American Literature (SENL240B) may be used to meet both the literature elective and African American experience requirements.

**FOREIGN LANGUAGE:** Must take a sequence - SSPN101B (SPAN100) and SSPN102B (SPAN101) or FREN100B and FREN101B. Spanish Recommended.

**HISTORY SEQUENCE** - SHIS111B (HIST114) and SHIS112B (HIST115) or SHIS224B (HIST224) and SHIS225B (HIST225) or HIST104 and HIST105 or HIST104 and SHIS225B or SHIS105 and SHIS224B

**HUMANITIES ELECTIVE** - Introduction to Philosophy (PHIL200B), or Introduction to Logic (PHIL210B), or Ethics (PHIL220), or Three Arts: Elements and Principles (HUMN241B) or Three Arts in History (HUMN242B) or Studies in Comparative Literature (HUMN244) or Race Relations (HUMN366). Race Relations (HUMN366) may be used to meet both the humanities elective and African American experience requirements.

**MATHEMATICS** - MATH130 or higher (excluding Math 204). Note – Statistics courses cannot be used to meet the mathematics requirement.

**SCIENCE ELECTIVE:** Chemistry, Earth Science, Physical Science or Physics - SCHE100, 113, 132, 133, PHYS201, SPHY102 103, 213 or 214

**STATISTICS (Elementary)** - SMAT130B (MATH274), PSYC274B or SOCL350B

## ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS AND INFORMATION

**African American Experience** “Students who are first time freshmen of any post-secondary institution on or after August 1, 1991, are required to pass a three-credit hour course in African American studies.” African American Literature (SENL240B) may be used to meet both the literature elective and African American experience requirements. Race Relations (HUMN366) may be used to meet both the humanities elective and African American experience requirements. History of Jazz (MUSC353B) may be used to meet both the arts elective and African American experience requirements.

See the SUBR Undergraduate catalog for additional courses that may be used as free electives and to meet the African American experience requirement.

**Service Learning (formerly Community Volunteerism)** “Students who were first time freshmen at any post-secondary institution on or after August 1, 1993, are required to complete a minimum of 60 clock hours of community service as one of the requirements for graduation”. Service Learning may be used for free elective credit and is completed through SVLR 100 - one credit hour, 200 - one credit hour, and 300 - one credit hour, OR 400 – three credit hours. See the SUBR Undergraduate catalog for exemption policies.

**Field Instruction** offers a block field placement or a standard field placement. SOCW 490, 491, 492, 493 is the standard sequence and completed in the Fall and Spring on Tuesday & Thursday. SOCW 494 & 495 is the block sequence and completed in one semester (Fall or Spring ) on Tuesday thru Friday and the student must have only Field Instruction, Field Seminar, Social Work Research and a 3 credit hour elective to complete degree requirements. A student in the block sequence cannot enroll in more than 16 credit hours and is expected to graduate the same semester they enrolled in the block sequence.

**Writing Proficiency Examination (WPE)** -Since Fall 2010, the Writing Proficiency Exam (WPE) has been facilitated as the final exam in English 111. If a student passes or has passed English 111 with a C or higher, the student has passed the WPE.

The WPE requirement is met if any of the following apply. The student has:

- ❖ Passed SENL102B (ENGL111) at SUBR during and since Fall2010.
- ❖ Completed the Writing Proficiency Exam at SUBR with grade of “P”.
- ❖ Passed English 1013 at BRCC, English 102 at Southern University at New Orleans, Southeastern Louisiana University, or at Delgado Community College (until Spring 2017).
- ❖ Completed English 111 under the SUSLA CONNECT banner on SUBR’s campus Fall 2013.
- ❖ Articulated a WPE test equivalent from any other institution.
