#### PROGRAM AUTHORIZATION:

Program Authorization: Louisiana Constitution of 1974, Article VIII, Section 7; The Master Plan for Postsecondary Education, 2011; LA R.S. 17:3216; R.S. 17:3221. "Southern University was established in the City of New Orleans by Act 87 of the 1880 General Assembly for the State of Louisiana. In 1891, Southern University was recognized by the Federal Government as a Land Grant College under the Federal Act of 1890, known as the Second Morrill Act of 1890. Act 17 of the 1892 Louisiana General Assembly formally approved the institution's agricultural and mechanical departments. Legislative Act 118 of 1912 authorized the closing and sale of Southern University in New Orleans, and relocation of the University to a new site. On March 9, 1914, Southern University was opened at its current location in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. The Louisiana Constitutional Convention of 1921 authorized the reorganization and expansion of Southern University; and Legislative Act 100 of 1922 provided that the University be reorganized under the control of the State Board of Education. Article 8 (Section 7) of the 1974 Louisiana Constitution authorized a Board of Supervisors for Southern University. Legislative Act 313 of 1975 included Southern University and Agricultural and Mechanical College as an institution in the Southern University System. The System is comprised of five units: Southern University and A&M College at Baton Rouge, Southern University in Shreveport, Southern University Law Center, and Southern University Agricultural Research and Extension Center. Southern University and A&M College at Baton Rouge constitutes the largest and most comprehensive of these five units.

Southern University and A&M College is categorized as a SREB Four-Year 3 institution, as a Carnegie Master's College and University (Master's Large), and as the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission of Colleges (SACSCOC) Level V institution.

The Southern University and A&M College serves a diverse student population and is committed to providing equal access and opportunity for all students who are in pursuit of academic success in public higher education."
