The College of Education prepares teachers to integrate technology through coursework and authentic classroom experiences (field-based practices, internships, and student teaching). The college also uses demonstrations, technology practice and professional development to train teacher candidates to integrate technology effectively into curricula and instruction.

The college has implemented an "Electronic Teacher Work Sample" that is used to collect, manage and analyze data in order to improve teaching and learning and to increase student achievement.

The College of Education maximizes learning opportunities for all students. A Technology Lab is housed in the College of Education to provide teacher education candidates with multiple means of representation, action and expression, and means of engagement. Coursework is designed to present information in ways that are understood by all students. Faculty members provide candidates with multiple ways of expressing themselves in courses through a variety of assignments. Further, teacher candidates are engaged in understanding learning styles and teaching styles. Other technology applications used are Visawords, Spelling City, and Victor Reader Stream, just to name a few.
