ENGLISH - Literature Elective may be selected from ENGL 201-207. Students may satisfy African American Experience by taking English 203 to meet the 3 hour Literature requirement.

Math Elective select Math 131 or higher (excluding Math 204)

Elementary Statistics -Mathematics 274 or Psychology 274 or Sociology 350

Science Elective Select from:Chemistry 128, 129, 130, 131, 132, or 133 for 3 hours of credit or Physics 101, 102, 201, or 202 for 3 or 4 hours of credit

Computer Science select from Introduction to Computer Technology, CMPS 105 or Microcomputer Applications in Business, CMPS 290 or Approved Substitute. Students transferring from another school or discipline must adhere to the following related to **Computer Science** – “Students whose programs do not require courses in computer science must enroll in CMPS 105 or 290, or an approved substitute (not more than five years old)”

ARTS select from Enjoyment of Music or History of Jazz (may be used to satisfy African American experience requirement) or Understanding the Arts

HISTORY select from American History 104 and 105 or History of Civilization 114 and 115 or History of the United States 224 and 225 (224 and 225 highly recommended)

HUMANITIES/PHILOSOPHY select from Three Arts: Elements and Principles HUMN 241 or Three Arts in History HUMN 242 or Studies in Comparative Literature: A Cultural Approach HUMN 244 or Race Relations HUMN 366 (may be used to satisfy African American experience requirement) or Introduction to Philosophy PHIL 200 or Introduction to Logic PHIL 210

FOREIGN LANGUAGE: Must take a sequence; Spanish Recommended

African American Experience “Students who are first time freshmen of any post-secondary institution on or after August 1, 1991, are required to pass a three-credit hour course in African American studies.”

Service Learning (formerly Community Volunteerism) “Students who were first time freshmen at any post-secondary institution on or after August 1, 1993, are required to complete a minimum of 60 clock hours of community service as one of the requirements for graduation”. Service Learning may be used for free elective credit and is completed through SVLR 100 - one credit hour, 200 - one credit hour, and 300 - one credit hour,, or 400 – three credit hours.

“D” grades – “If the “D” is ten or more years old and if the student has been out of school for ten or more consecutive years since the “D” was made, the “D” cannot be used to satisfy any part of the requirements for graduation.

Writing Proficiency Examination (WPE) -Since Fall 2010, the Writing Proficiency Exam (WPE) has been facilitated as the final exam in English 111. If a student passes or has passed English 111 with a C or higher, the student has passed the WPE.

- There is no external grade applied to the student's transcript for the WPE.

- Also, if a transfer student articulates a class equivalent to English 111 during or after Fall 2010, he or she does not have to take the WPE. **Again, there is no external grade applied to the student's transcript for the WPE.**
- Note: If the student has not taken English 111, he or she must register for the course, not the WPE. If he or she has a transfer equivalent to English 111, he or she **should not** register for the WPE externally.
- Note: If the student passed English 111 with a C or higher before Fall 2010, he or she **must** register for the WPE.

Above restated via Memo circulated January 2016:

The following information concerns those who should or should not be enrolled in English 1 (WPE).

A student DOES NOT have to register for English 1 (WPE):

1. He or she has passed English 111 at SUBR during and since Fall 2010.
2. He or she is currently taking English 111 at SUBR.
3. He or she has passed English 101 at BRCC.
4. He or she has articulated a WPE test equivalent from any other institution.

A student DOES have to register for English 1 (WPE):

1. He or she passed English 111 before Fall 2010.
2. He or she has transferred to SUBR and has not articulated an equivalent to the WPE test itself.

Note: Even though an equivalent for SUBR's English 111 has been accepted by SUBR, the students must show proof and must have articulated an equivalent to the WPE test itself.

Note: SUBR's English Department does not have any information from any institution other than BRCC. Therefore, the student would need to provide the information via a course description and complete the articulation process.

Field Instruction offers a block field placement and a concurrent field Placement. SOCW 490, 491, 492, 493 is the concurrent sequence and completed in the Fall and Spring on Tuesday & Thursday. SOCW 494 & 495 is the block sequence and completed in one semester (Fall or Spring (if offered)) on Tuesday thru Friday and the student must have only Field Instruction, Field Seminar, Social Work Research and a 3 credit hour elective to complete degree requirements. A student in the block sequence cannot enroll in more than 16 credit hours and is expected to graduate the same semester they enrolled in the block sequence.
